- For example, “CMMC” isn’t listed, but EBSCO is. EBSCO is the company that owns the largest number of our databases.
- Click on “EBSCOhost Databases”.
- If you are OFF campus, read Step 3B.

Search - Step 3B

Search - Step 10

- That removed articles you shouldn't use.
- Not all articles are available. There are three "types" of articles:
 - Held Locally – in the physical building
 - Full-Text Online – either HTML or PDF
 - Not available either way
- Look at the lines under the title. If it doesn't say "Is held locally" or give a "Full-Text" link, then the article is not available.

Search - Step 12

- This is also called the “citation” page, since it contains information about the article. Much of it you might not need.
- The main parts are:
 - Title – the title of the article
 - Author – the author(s) of the article
 - Source – the title of the journal, date published, volume, issue, & page numbers
 - Subject Terms – subjects covered in the article (those marked * are main subjects)

 - Database – the one you are searching
